The GILTI regs are an early Christmas present for US multinationals, with the general high-tax exception and the aggregate approach for domestic partnerships being better received than the latest video game. But the anti-abuse rule in the DRD regs is a sting in the tail. And if the mischief is basis step-up transactions during the "disqualified period", why put the anti-abuse rule in the DRD regs? Because that's where the only possible statutory authority is?

In fashion this week: countries presenting **Budgets, VAT** reverse charges, and tax havens trying to outdo each other with economic substance rules!
